**RE: Triple Undergraduate Degrees in CoE**

Per your request, the Academic Rules Working Group revisited, again, the Triple Undergraduate Degrees in the CoE.

ARWG recommends that if an undergraduate student wishes to receive a second, third, or more, undergraduate degree from CoE 2005-206 Bulletin, page 57, "Requirements for an Additional Bachelor's Degree" should be changed to read (change noted in *italics*):

*Additional bachelor's degrees can be conferred in the College of Engineering, Ann Arbor campus.*

*1. To obtain an additional bachelor degree (including prescribed) in the College of Engineering, a student must complete the requirements of each of the degree programs. In addition, for the additional degree, the student must complete at least a minimum of 14 additional credit hours in pertinent technical subjects over the number required for the first degree. No technical course can be applied to meet the requirements of more than two degrees. The credit hours that are used to satisfy each of the degree programs also must satisfy the cumulative grade point average requirement of 2.00 or more. Approval by involved departments is required.*

If this recommendation is approved by the CoE Curriculum Committee along with the CoE Faculty, then the wordage on page 58, "Undergraduate Engineering Degrees," second paragraph, must be revised to reflect the change. Specifically, ARWG recommends the wordage as (change noted in *italics*):

Many of the courses required for one program may be transferred to meet the requirements of another. This opportunity to obtain *additional* undergraduate engineering degrees must be discussed with the pertinent program advisor. ~~Note that a maximum of two bachelor's degrees can be earned in the College of Engineering, Ann Arbor campus.~~ See "*Requirements for an Additional Bachelor's Degree.*"
